He reported our Treasury balance at \$5,200. Members lauded newsletter editor Charley Drake for an excellent first effort in publishing the January issue. Charley took over the Editor's job this year from former Editor Nick Van. The Club Library is enjoying a surge in donated books and videos, according to Librarian Gary Dainilson. The library has a liberal annual budget for woodworking books and DVD's, but lately members have been sharing their former texts and videos by donation. MAKING TABLE LEGS

The ideal table leg would be made from straight grained, rift sawn wood. What's rift sawn wood? Rift sawn wood occurs when the growth rings run diagonal or corner-to-corner on the end of the wood. Rift sawn wood will produce legs with a similar grain patterns on all four sides. The uniform grain pattern greatly enhances the appearance of a project.

If you do not have rift sawn stock, you can create it if your stock is thick enough. Simply make a square template. Place the template on the end of the piece orienting it so that the growth rings runs corner-to-corner. Mark it and cut it out. Leave the pieces a bit over sized because removing wood in this manner greatly alters the internal stresses in the wood. Let the piece relax for a several days before bringing it to the final dimensions.

You can laminate stock to achieve your desired thickness. If the legs are to be tapered, make sure the laminations are thick enough so that you do not cut through a layer before the end of the taper. Cutting through a layer will expose a horizontal seam consisting of end grain.

I'm using this technique for a writing desk I'm working on.

Meeting at Windsor Plywood in Bellingham, north county members took advantage of the short trip and helped fill the house. It was standing room only for most as the crowd exceeded the expectations of our hosts, who are one of our most active discount sources. The invitation to explore another popular Washington woodworking dealer's domain added credibility to the mantra that you can't have too many clamps, or tools, or wood.

Business was brisk, considering the down economy, as many took advantage of a deep discount in clamps, hardwoods, and other specials. In a brief introduction to the local Windsor Plywood store we received a catalog and leaflet covering their major product, hardwood plywood. Store executives provided commentary on basic plywood types, their configuration, advantages and pricing, and answered many questions concerning wood in general and why prices fluctuate. The store has a huge information board on the wall behind the cashier stand where the current lumber prices are marked. These prices per board foot are set from Canadian headquar-

ters and sent daily to the 60 franchises. Half of these outlets are in British Columbia, with only four in the United States. Spokane, with two, and Great Falls, Montana are the other U. S. stores.

Windsor Plywood is a major source for our woodworking needs and we are gratified that they have chosen to participate in our Club's Member Discount Program. They offer an important line of home living and outdoor products as well as tools, exotic woods, hardware, and finishes. It is to our advantage to take note of what a large, competitive retailer can offer woodworkers in terms of price and quality.

Only a few months ago we held a similar meeting at Sound Cedar's store in Mount Vernon. It, too, was well-attended. Program Chairman Jim Bucknell may have found the golden key. He plans to hit the road with another Bellingham monthly Club meeting in June, at Targo Woods, a popular Club discounter with a knack for finding exotic and unusual species of timber. You won't want to miss this one either.

Minutes of the NCWA Board Meeting

- 1. Agenda approved by acclamation.
- 2. Treasurer Doug Duehning reported our regular checking account balance as \$4,428.30 and our savings account balance as \$986.00. As of today's board meeting we have 90 paid members. The Hillcrest Lodge is asking NCWA to reserve dates for 2011. Doug will pay for 2010 reserving all months but April, May & August. The rates have increased to \$55 per meeting. A 60-day cancellation is required for a refund. It was agreed that Doug would reserve all months in 2011 except April and August. We will not get a credit for February 2010 but we will receive a credit for the date in 2009 when we were unable to get in because the locks had been changed.
