Update on the Port Townsend Wooden Boat Festival

This year's Wooden Boat Festival runs from Friday, September 9th through Sunday, September 11th, and features more than 300 wooden vessels, hundreds of indoor and outdoor presentations and demonstrations, music performances, food vendors, etc. For more information see

There will *two* Woodworking Stages featuring presentations by Chris Schwarz (former editor of Popular Woodworking), Mike Wenzloff of Wenzloff Saws, Jim Tolpin & Tim Lawson of the Port Townsend School of Woodworking, and many others. For a complete schedule see

Lie-Nielsen, Lee Valley, Edensaw, and Sawstop will have exhibit booths where you can try out hand tools, ask questions, and watch demonstrations.

The festival always draws a large crowd, so carpooling to the ferry is a must. There will be carpool sign-up sheets at Tuesday's meeting for interested members. The ferry leaves from Keystone Ferry Landing on Whidbey Island. From there, members will walk-on to the ferry for the 1/2 hour ride to Port Townsend. In Port Townsend, there will be free shuttle buses running between the ferry landing and the festival every ten minutes.

The ferry costs \$5.50 round-trip for a walk-on passenger, \$2.70 round-trip for seniors over age 65. Festival admission for a single day costs \$15, \$10 for seniors over age 65. Don't miss it!

Douglas Fisher on Saturday October 22nd, 9am to 4pm at the Anacortes First Baptist Church. Cost is \$35.00 pre-registered or \$40.00 at the door. Lunch, snacks & beverages are included!



Doug is from Parksville, B.C. on Vancouver Island and is one of the rising stars in woodturning with unique artistry and innovative techniques. Doug became a full time professional artist in 1992 and since 1997 has focused on wood sculptures, primarily made using the lathe. Doug collaborated with a British Columbia First Nation artist for several years and now, since that artist's passing, continues to utilize First Nation inspired art for the visual designs in most of his pieces.

Doug's work makes use of multi-center turning techniques to create the base piece. He then carves, textures and burns utilizing techniques that can be applied to many types of woodworking, not just turned objects. His unique finishing utilizes inks and stains applied in multiple layers to attain an "old wood" patina that is quite wonderful. His finished works are beautiful!
