



EDUCATION COMMITTEE REPORT



Tool Definitions

DRILL PRESS: A tall upright machine useful for suddenly snatching flat metal bar stock out of your hands so that it smacks you in the chest and flings your beer across the room, denting the freshly-painted project which you had carefully set in the corner where nothing could get to it.

WIRE WHEEL: Cleans paint off bolts and then throws them somewhere under the workbench with the speed of light. Also removes fingerprints and hard-earned calluses from fingers in about the time it takes you to say, <Oh sh--!>

SKILL SAW: A portable cutting tool used to make studs too short.

BOARD MEETS TO START OFF FALL SEASON

After almost two months of inactivity, the Board of Directors met at the Farmhouse Restaurant on Route 20 on Wednesday night, September 21, to discuss plans for the new 2011-2012 NCWA season. The Board quickly appointed a Naminating Committee to prepare a slate of officers for announcement at the October meeting. Elections will be held the following month.

President Jerry Couchman laid a lengthy Agenda before the Board, while at the same time noting that only a bare quorum was present. Some of his action items were going to be postponed due to he absence of key chairmen. A discussion took place regarding the shop safety training of the large number of new members aboard who have little or no woodworking experience. We have added dozens of new members recently who claim to be beginners and who should be given specialized shop safety instruction before they take the more advanced classes given by the Club. Education Chairman Gerald Anderson and Membership Chairman Ed Pysher have been working on the details of this special instruction, which is expected to start next month.

Pysher said we now have 139 members, a considerable boost over last year at this time, and that many are at the beginners' stage. They are eager to learn the basics but need safety instruction before doing hands-on shop activity. Anderson said he put sign-up forms on the tables for all classes at the September general meeting. The Board suggested that the crowding at the tables was slowing down the process and that more sign-up space should be found. A few of the classes are full or nearly so. Val Matthews is giving two different classes in hand plane making; the new class is shoulder planes. Anderson said none of the Saturday sessions will be given on holiday weekends, and he noted that the sculpture and carving class has been cancelled.

Member-at-Large Mike Titus has accepted the job of Webmeister and he is planning to rid the website of some old material in an effort to up-date it and make it more useful. He has set a goal for himself to complete the task by the end of the year.

President Couchman said the date for the Fall Shop Tours, set for the Bellingham area, is now October 15th. Further details will be announced soon by Chair Gary Danilson. The Toys for Tots annual dinner meeting is scheduled for the November general meeting on Tuesday, November 1. Spouses and friends are invited to take part in this celebration where we honor those members who have contributed their talent and energies to providing a Christmas for needy youngsters. Advance meal reservations are required for this salad and pizza affair.

Newsletter Editor Charley Drake who has put together our video and sound system has suggested that we purchase lighting equipment and possibly another microphone to augment the present system. Couchman asked for a dollar estimate and suggested Charley take advantage of the balance unused in the earlier funding of \$1500. Couchman also discussed courses available at the Port Townsend School of Woodworking and their quality of instruction. The School usually invites the public to an open-house in the Spring. We will be informed. Couchman also said that David Gray, a professional furniture maker and speaker for our October meeting, will be paid \$120 for his time and expenses.

Andrew Peller has drafted a letter of application addressing the non-profit status of NCWA in a continuing

search for insurance waivers for our woodworking classes. No action was taken at this time.

The meeting adjourned at 8:35 p.m.

2011 Port Townsend Woodworker's Show

Submissions are sought from furniture makers, boat builders, instrument makers, turners, carvers and other woodworkers in Port Townsend and adjacent areas for the Port Townsend Woodworker's Show 2011. Submissions should be well-crafted original designs. No work from kits or commercially available plans will be accepted.

In 2011, we are limiting the number of booths to 25 and will give preference to local woodworkers. We're introducing an early signup registration fee of \$50 which rises to \$75 after September 7th, 2011. All applications must be received by 1 October, 2011. We will also give preference to woodworkers who are able to help us by distributing posters and setting up the venue.

We recommend that you be present during the show to sell your own work but you may leave business cards. We will not be selling your work for you. No commission will be taken on work sold.

Show hours are Saturday November 5, 2011, from 11 am to 8 pm (to coincide with the Gallery Walk) and Sunday November 6 from 11 am to 3 pm.

You will need to deliver and set up your work Friday November 4 between 2 pm and 7 pm and pick up your work on November 6 between 3 pm and 5 pm. If your work is not self-supporting, you will need to provide a support. If you need more than 8' x 5' please contact us to make arrangements. Wall space is available. Power is also available by request.

Your application fee helps us cover the cost of hall rental, advertising and includes a listing on the show's website.


