February Meeting

Mark Clemens, the Washington representative for Epilog Lasers with be the speaker/demonstrator for the February meeting. Epilog Laser manufactures machines that engrave, cut and mark materials; most familiar to our membership as equipment that creates our membership name badges.

Mark will have a brief explanation and presentation and then demonstrate how the Epilog Laser will covert any image, i.e.: photo, line art, logo, etc. into an engraved image on most any material, i.e.: wood, glass, plastic, etc. Their web site: www.epiloglaser.com has a lot of interesting information, including several success stories of woodworkers who have created an income source by providing this service for their communities. There are some interesting examples of cutting delicate wood pieces with the laser.

Members are urged to bring an image and a piece of material they would like that image engraved on, for demonstration purposes. The image should be no larger than 8 x 10 to fit the scanner and the material should be no larger than 18" x 24" to fit the engraving machine. We anticipate that everyone will be accommodated.

Also, don't forget that the "found object" contest will be conducted at this meeting. To participate, take some object from your garage, shop, attic or the local junk yard and incorporate it into something useful or decorative using wood as a medium. Prizes and bragging rights will be awarded.

This should be an exciting program for everyone. Don't forget to bring something to be engraved! -Cec Braeden
