## Smart Production Techniques Keep Aanes Furniture in the Pink

One of the privileges of membership in **NCWA** is the opportunity to poke our noses into the affairs and concerns commercial woodworkers. It's our chance to see and hear what it takes to be successful in the arts and business parts of real production shops. **Greg Furniture** Aanes **Company** in Bellingham has been a successful

producer of fine furniture for several decades and **Greg** stays on top of profitability by shrewd decisions that balance the costs of human labor versus specialized machines. For example, his working force at one time was 15, now down to five, including **Greg**, and production quantities have not changed. That's working smarter, not faster.

**Greg** has invested heavily in precision machinery that keeps his line of furniture flowing out the door.

Two of his employees do sanding work only, leaving the other three to design, create, and finish some 600 units of quality chairs, tables, stools, and rockers each year. He makes 5 styles of chairs and 2 styles of rockers, and the variations are evident by the numerous jigs that line the walls of his two-

story shop. Most of his beautiful designs of high quality items are made of cherry, a hallmark of the finest furniture wood. At the time of our visit in early May he was selling off some of his inventory to individuals during a short-week sale, something he rarely does.

Greg, a former NCWA member, was eager to

answer questions about his work and the pitfalls of meeting city ordinances. The dust produced by his machines is always under civil scrutiny and the cause of frequent city inspections. But the company has prospered partly because of **Greg's** heavy investment in air scrubbing controls. In the overhead of his high-bay building a maze of duct work, blowers and vacuum lines have been installed to keep the dust pollution within allowable limits. It's a spendy system but a necessity to protect his workers. — **Jay Geisel** 

### Big Crowd in Bellingham

It was a great turnout; more than 50 members descended on **Greg Aames Furniture** shop in Bellingham for the May 6<sup>th</sup> monthly meeting. All attempts at getting the members in the building for a business meeting were difficult indeed. **Greg's** shop is a beehive of activity by day and dedicated to production, not conferences. **Greg** walked us through his high-bay building through the various production stages that generated such fine furniture pieces, a trademark known and respected throughout the country.

**Jim Bucknell**, Programs Chair, introduced **Greg**, at the start of the evening. A short business meeting followed the tour with Vice President **Jeff O'Donell** presiding.

An interesting Bring and Brag discussion was given by **RP Myers** who is an experienced sculptor and carver. **RP** showed us a winged bowl created out of scrap of quilted maple, a corner of a band saw round he cut for his wife's lathe work. The right-angled, ell-shaped scrap had possibilities, he said, for a bowl of its own. The beautifully finished piece was crafted using the Proxxon-Micromot Motorized Carver SGM, which **RP** highly recommends. – **Jay Geisel**
