A new slate of individuals recommended by Bob Doop's nominating committee were voted into office unopposed. Our new NCWA President for 2003 is Nick Van of Camano Island. Other elected officials are Vice President Rick Anderson, Bellingham; Treasurer Ed Pysher, Bow, and repeat Secretary Jay Geisel, LaConner.

Gary, who held various offices on and off during 18 years of Club history, served the office of President for the past two years. His accomplishments with our organization are notable, especially the membership growth and the intensified interest in local woodworking brought about by involvement in community service. Gary's proudest achievement was a challenging donation project that involved our Club in a national program to build flag display cases for the families of New York policemen and firemen who lost their lives on 9-11. With his generosity and under his direction, our members helped to build more than 30 triangular U.S. Memorial Flag display boxes to tight national specifications over a six-week period in Gary's Sedro Woolley cabinet shop. Gary's leadership was honored at the election meeting where he was presented with an album of memorabilia by Bob Doop. Larry Tomovick and Laura Mathews were the other officers who contributed so much to the success of NCWA during the past year.
