#### EDUCATION COMMITTEE REPORT TO NCWA BOARD 2-8-12

- 1. All classes until March 31st are full
- 2. Box & Shoulder Plane classes have wait lists. Instructor Val Matthews & I are working to figure out how to schedule the overload.

SUGGESTION: No more wait lists, until there are more instructors willing to learn & teach the very popular classes that normally overflow with students.

3. We tried 4 classes tailored to beginning woodworkers. Woodworking Overview was full. The four classes, Woodworking Overview, Power tool Safety I, Flat, Straight & Square, and Getting Started (hands-on stool making) only had a total of 10 persons take them. The second Power tool Safety class had to be cancelled due to lack of participation.

SUGGESTION: Offer these classes again, but don't term them, "Beginning" classes. Something like "Fundamentals of Wood Preparation", etc. might draw more interest.

4. The committee will meet soon to start formulating the 2012 /2013 classes. Steve Wagoner may be willing to teach a Windsor-type stool making class. This is just in the talking stage right now. Other limited enrollment, project-type classes may be added, depending on the interest shown by the membership.


