John Miller

October Program

The October speaker is John Miller, an owner and manager of Cascade Joinery, in Ferndale, WA. He has spent his entire career in construction and cabinet making, working first in cabinet shops and later in 3 timber frame companies. John helped start Dreaming Creek Timber Frame Homes in 1991, where he spurred its growth from creating timber frames with portable power tools to Computer Numerical Control (CNC) machines. John came to Cascade Joinery in 2006, where he is able to work in the field as well as the office for clients up and down the west coast, including Alaska and Hawaii. John has been active in national organizations, such as the Timber Framer's Guild and Timber Frame Business Council, including terms as President of both. John will be speaking about Cascade Joinery and the process of timber framing. He will cover the materials used and how they are prepared. He will talk about using hand, power tools, and (CNC) Machines to cut large scale joinery and will also cover the process of timber frame projects from shop drawings to installation. The talk will wind up with a slide show of completed projects. If you're interested in the beautiful art of timber framing or how to create joinery measured in inches, rather than eighths, this is the program for you.

He also has a full range of power tools but many of the jobs to be done on his boats are done quicker and very accurately with the traditional hand tools. His wood supply will make you drool with envy. Alaska yellow cedar 16" wide, 30+ feet long with no knots and lots of it is typical. There will be a sign up sheet at our next meeting on the 4th. Right now there are 16 people with a 30 person limit. We will also offer a tour in the spring. Hope you take advantage of this opportunity.



The class will cover processing the wood, making a stepped dado, cutting the miters, splining on the mortiser and clamping & glue-up. Cost is \$225.00.



WOODEN BOAT BUILDING

Do you want to build a cedar strip rowboat? Some of you may have noticed the pictures in last month's newsletter of my rowboat at the Anacortes Arts Festival. It is a Cosine Wherry, a sweet rowing, tried and true mid 1980s design. The hull is made of 1/4 inch thick cedar strips, fiberglassed inside and out. The hull is built upside down on a series of MDF molds mounted on a wooden strong back. Building and fairing the molds is a bit of hassle and, since I have the molds already made, I have been hoping someone else might use my molds to make themselves another boat. If any NCWA member wants to build one, I will set up and true the strong back and molds in your shop. The rest is up to you. Since I recently went through it, I would also be willing to give advice on the building process. This is not a quick and easy boat to build, so never mind unless you want to spend a bit of time on it. I am retired and it took me four months to build, staying steadily after it. It could probably be done quicker. I tried to make everything look pretty good so I didn't cut many corners. The boat is 14 feet long by 4 feet wide and you need at least a 12 x 20 foot open area to build it in, with a solid floor of some kind and good light. In the winter the space really needs to be heated if you don't want to wait forever for epoxy to set.. If you think you are interested, call me, Jim Redding, at (206)307-4553 to discuss it.



NCWA Board of Directors Meeting

September 14, 2016

- President Charley Drake convened the meeting at 7:55 p.m. at the Farmhouse Restaurant in Mt. Vernon.
- Members present: John Braun, Dave Strauss, Jerry Anderson, Tim Wynn, Jim Redding, Charley Drake, Phil Choquette, David Shull, Al Ashley, Gary Danilson
- Treasurer's Report (submitted verbally at meeting with follow up hard copy).
 - o Total cash on hand in checking and savings is \$4,371.42 as of 9/14/2016.
 - o Total paid members 192. This includes 29 new members this year.
 - o The annual BBQ cost \$530.24 of which half will be reimbursed by the Turners.
 - o Al noted that he would start collecting dues for AY2017 at the October meeting.
- Charley Drake led an after action review of our participation in the Anacortes Arts Festival. There was a
 general consensus by the BOD to participate again next year with improvements to the displays and
 demonstrations.
- Charley Drake led a discussion on the BBQ. Tim Wynn indicated there were a total of approximately 75 individuals at the BBQ. This number included NCWA members and guests as well as Turner members and guests. This would suggest that the NCWA probably had 20-30 actual members present. Was this a good use of NCWA resources? After extended discussion, the BOD unanimously agreed that the event was worth the resources expended and should be repeated again next year.
- The Shop Tours on October 15 at Anacortes were discussed. Special thanks to Gary Danilson and John Bellinger for arranging the tour.
- Jerry Anderson gave a report on the new members' class. This has started out very well. The participants are very enthusiastic about the program. The class catalogue is being finalized and will be distributed in the near future. Very special thanks for Jim Bucknell for taking the lead as principal instructor.
- Charley Drake announced that NCWA was still on track to participate in the LaConner Arts Alive festival on November 5th and 6th. More details will be forthcoming.
- Charley Drake led a discussion on the nominating process for officers for the new year. Dave Strauss current V.P. agreed to be nominated as President. Al Ashley agreed to continue serving as Treasurer. Tim Wynn agreed to continue serving as Secretary. The Nominating committee will meet to see if they can find candidates for program chair, membership chair, and Vice President.
- The meeting was adjourned at 8:20 p.m.
