NCWA General Meeting Notes July 11, 2017

- The meeting was convened by NCWA Vice President Dale Brandland at the Northstar Doors facility in Ferndale at 7:00 p.m.
- Greg Koenker gave the report for the Education Committee.
 - Jerry Couchman will give an advanced box making class that will take place over the first three Saturdays in November.
 - The Education Committee is looking for volunteers to be instructors and assistant instructors during the next year. Contact Greg if you are even remotely interested.
- Andrew Pellar gave an announcement on the Port Townsend Wooden Boat Festival which will take place September 8-10. He urged members to make the trip as it would be well worth it.
 - Andrew indicated that they were working to get Garrett Hack to give a presentation to the NCWA in conjunction with his possible attendance at the festival. This is far from a 'done deal' but would be great if it happens.
- Dale Brandland updated the members on the progress of the strategic planning initiative. He indicated that in the two discussion groups to date there had been almost 50% participation from the members in the area. The next meets will be:

NCWA Board of Directors Meeting July 12, 2017

- The meeting was convened at 7:00 p.m. by President Dave Strauss at the Farmhouse Restaurant in Mt. Vernon.
- Members Present: Tim Wynn, Jim Redding, Dave Strauss, Phil Choquette, Mike Chaplin, Gary Danilson, David Vandette, John Braun, Bill Rawls, Al Ashley.
- Others present: Sascha Vandette
- Al Ashley gave the Treasurer's Report:
 - NCWA has a total of \$5,414.41 in checking and savings as of 07/12/2017.
 - NCWA currently has 200 paid members (compared to 191 last year at this time).
 - We have had 27 new members this year.
- David Vandette then reviewed the status of preparations for the Anacortes Arts Festival (August 4,5,6):
 - All demonstration slots have been filled except for two on Sunday.
 - David indicated that we still needed greeters and display items. This comment led to a general discussion on how the NCWA can get more participation. It was suggested that Board send out another email to members requesting their help.
 - Toys for Tots indicated that they will have 108 toy trucks and cars for the Festival and that they probably had enough wheels for the toys but that they would appreciate some more to provide a working margin.
- David Vandette indicated that the BBQ would be on August 26th. NCWA needed a volunteer to pick up the BBQ although the Turners are getting the food and cooking. John Braun volunteered to pick up the BBQ.
 - It was noted that there was a continuing decrease in the participation in the BBQ. This triggered another discussion on increasing participation.
 - Tim Wynn indicated he would put an article in the newsletter on the BBQ.
- Audio System. Mike Chaplin indicated that they needed a target amount in order to make a good recommendation to the Board for upgrading the audio system. Al Ashley pointed out that there was a \$1000 line item in the budget for equipment purchases. Mike agreed to use that number to develop a recommendation to the board.
- There will be a Shop Tour in the Burlington/Mt. Vernon area in October. Tim Wynn was requested to put an announcement in the newsletter requesting volunteers.
- The meeting was adjourned at 7:45 p.m.
