- Announcements.
 - George Knutson indicated that they were still looking for more volunteers for the Shop Tour Committee.
 - George also announced that the November and the December General Meeting will return to the Hillcrest Lodge in Mt. Vernon. Meeting time will be the same i.e. 7:00 p.m.
 - John Bellinger reminded everyone that the fall shop tour would be in the Whatcom County area. An email will be coming with details.
 - Al Ashley is collecting dues for CY2019. The dues will be \$35.
 - Al reminded Board members that their input for the annual budget was due.
- Bring & Brag.
 - Dennis Lindsay showed off a really nice 'Beads of Courage' Box. It was made of Alder and Cherry. He finished it with Shellac and oil.
 - Laura Matthews brought a very touching tribute for Jay Geisel. Jay brought many wonderful items to Bring & Brag over the years. Laura made a Road Runner out of Wild Cherry based on a pattern given to her by Jay's wife.
 - Richard Schofield showed us a Saw Stop Saw blade that had been stopped by the automatic brake. It was a great reminder of the technology available now. The Saw Stop blade attracted a lot of attention during the break.
 - Dennis O'hearn brought the first Ukulele that he crafted. It was made out of Mahogany and Spruce. He used a French polish finish (and vowed never to use that particular method again.)
 - Samantha Chang showed us her Wood Block Print that she made in the Wood Block Print class. She mounted it in a really nice black walnut frame.
 - Rhett Winter displayed a Black Walnut record box which he made as his first project with skills learned from Jim Bucknell's Intro to Woodworking Class. He finished it with Shellac and Poly. Really nice job, Rhett.
 - Jerry Couchman showed us his marquetry which he used as a demonstration project at the Anacortes Arts Festival. Nice job, Jerry.
- Raffle awarded a series of FASTCAP items to a number of club members.
- Program. Brian Noel of Bearkat Wood (an NCWA member!) narrated his journey from a beginning woodworker to a maker of master hand saws and furniture. 

- 1. TAKE SR 20 TO I-5 IN BURLINGTON & TURN SOUTH
- 2. USE KINCAID ST. EXIT #226 & TURN RIGHT ONTO KINCAID ST.
- 3. GO UNDER FREEWAY TO CLEVELAND ST & TURN RIGHT (SOUTH)
- 4. DRIVE SOUTH ABOUT 1 MILE, CLEVELAND DEAD-ENDS ON BLACKBURN ROAD
- 5. TURN RIGHT ON BLACKBURN & DRIVE ¼ MILE
- 6. TURN LEFT AT MV CHRISTIAN SCHOOL SIGN & ENTER PARKING LOT

FROM NORTH:

TAKE I-5 EXIT 226

FOLLOW DIRECTIONS #2 – 6.

FROM SOUTH:

- 1. TAKE 1-5 EXIT #226 (ANDERSON RD) TURN LEFT AT END OF RAMP
- 2. CROSS OVER I-5 & TURN RIGHT ON OLD HIGHWAY 99
- 3. DRIVE NORTH ABOUT ¾ MILE TO BLACKBURN ROAD
- 4. TURN LEFT ON BLACKBURN ROAD
- 5. TRAVEL ¼ MILE TO MV CHRISTIAN SCHOOL & TURN LEFT INTO PARKING LOT 6.

IF YOU FORGET & GO TO HILLCREST PARK:

- 1. TURN RIGHT, GOING OUT OF PARKING LOT ONTO 13TH ST.

NCWA Board of Directors Meeting

October 10, 2018

NCWA Board of Directors Meeting

- The meeting was convened at 7:00 p.m. by Vice President George Knutson at the Farmhouse Restaurant in Mt. Vernon.
- Members present: Tim Wynn, Sascha Vandette, David Vandette, Bill Rawls, John Braun, Jerry Anderson, Dave Strauss, Gary Danilson, Phil Choquette, Al Ashley, George Knutson
- George reported that the Nominating Committee had been able to identify persons for all positions except the newly identified 'Assistant Secretary' position. The Board discussed options for finding substitutes when Tim Wynn was traveling.
- George indicated that the Shop Tour had four shops in Whatcom County to visit plus lunch at Tom Dolese's shop.
- Treasurer's report.
 - The checking and savings accounts had a total of \$6,726.94.
 - The NCWA currently has a total of 230 members.
 - o 50 members have paid their dues for 2019 so far.
- Gary Danilson brought up the question of membership for couples. He questioned whether there was any benefit to having a 'spousal' membership as there was no mention of that status in the by-laws. After extended discussion of the pros and cons, Gary Danilson moved and Dave Strauss seconded a motion "to eliminate the spousal membership but 'grandfather' those couple who currently held that status." The motion was passed unanimously.
- The Board then discussed the potential new general meeting venue at Mt. Vernon Christian School.
 - There was general agreement that it was an excellent venue although there were several 'teething' issues to workout.
 - After discussion, Gary Danilson moved and Sascha Vandette seconded a motion that the NCWA move its general meeting location to the Mt. Vernon Christian School as of the January 2019 meeting.
- The Board then took up the proposed budget for 2019.
 - The draft budget showed a deficit of \$2500 when the additional cost of the Mt. Vernon Christian School, an increase to the shows budget and an increase to the 'Toys for Tots' budget were included.
 - After extended discussion, the Shows budget and the Toys for Tots budget were slightly decreased.
 - After more discussion, Bill Rawls moved and John Braun seconded a motion to eliminate the membership reward program (tool raffle) for 2019.
 - A suggestion was made that NCWA hold a two for one raffle in place of the membership rewards program. This raffle would give half the proceeds to the winner of the raffle and the other half would go to the NCWA. No final decision was made on this suggestion.
 - After the reductions listed above, the Board had configured a balanced budget.
- The meeting adjourned at 8:25 p.m.
