How to Access ZOOM for July 7th Meeting

Thanks to those of you who attended our first, official Zoom Monthly Meeting this past June 2nd. The feedback has been excellent, and building on that momentum, we look forward to another wonderful virtual presentation next month, on July 7th.

Our July meeting will feature a presentation on greenwood chairmaking by Brendan Gaffney. Brendan is a well-regarded furniture designer, woodworker, educator, and author of an upcoming book on woodworker James Krenov. Since Brendan will be joining us from his shop in Kentucky, our **July 7th meeting will begin with Brendan's presentation at 5:30 PM, PST.**

Prior to Brendan's presentation, **NCWA members are welcomed to login to Zoom beginning at 5:00 PM** to allow some time for those wanting or needing to get familiar with the Zoom format before the presentation begins at 5:30 PM.

Brendan's presentation will go from 5:30 - 6:30, and allow for about 15 minutes of Q & A time included in the hour. After that, Jim Bucknell will conduct our other meeting business and announcements, and we'll conduct a virtual Bring and Brag (this is your chance to show off something that might normally be too large to bring down to our meetings in person).

As a refresher...a couple of tips and/or things to be aware of for Zoom meetings...

At 5:30 PM the Zoom host (King Dahl) will mute everyone's microphones. This will eliminate background noise that can come over your mic inadvertently, even if you are not speaking.

There are two buttons to be aware of at the bottom of your screen - the Participants Button and the Chat Button. Depending on whether you are using a Mac, PC, iPad, iPhone, or other device, the buttons may be in slightly different locations.

Clicking the Participants Button allows you to view a list of all NCWA members that have joined the Zoom meeting. It also allows you to click a button to "Raise your hand" if you'd like to be unmuted to speak or ask a question. Using this "Raise your hand" feature helps avoid confusion and the potential of people talking over each other.

The Chat Button allows you to chat/text to a specific person during the meeting, privately, or you can send a message to everyone in attendance. Anytime during Brendan's presentation, if you have a question for him, **Chat it to NCWA Wood (that goes to the host, King Dahl)** and he will forward it to Brendan at the appropriate time. We will do our best to get as many questions answered as possible.

Lastly, if for any reason, your internet drops you from the meeting, re-click the invitation link to re-join. Everyone's internet service is a bit different, with some better than others, so we hope your service will allow a pleasant viewing and participatory experience for you.

We look forward to our second Virtual NCWA Monthly Meeting on July 7th.

News from the Educational Program

As you all know, the NCWA Board has voted to cancel all in person events, including classes, through the end of August, due to the Covid-19 pandemic. While we all hope for a return to more normal days, and a resumption of our club activities, with our large number of 'at risk' members, it is realistic to think that many will not be comfortable attending events, even when they do resume. With that in mind, the educational committee and Instructors met via Zoom to discuss ways in which we could contribute to the club during these trying times.

While there are no concrete plans in place, I'd like to update you as to some of the ideas that were discussed, and that might be implemented in coming days.

1. The initial proposal was to attempt to have some live demonstrations by individual instructors, which any members who wished to attend, could do so via Zoom. While this is a possibility, the general feeling is that our instructors do not have the video production skills to make this work smoothly.
2. We then considered picking some specific topics, screening online videos on those topics, and then having a Zoom event in which we would show the best video we could find on the subject, and follow that up with a discussion or Q&A session with our instructors.
3. We next discussed forming some focus groups that have a shared interest in a certain aspect of woodworking, and having meetings in which they might share videos, or personal knowledge about the topic, and have a general discussion.
4. Finally we talked about the possibility of having an online version of the Shop Talk events that the Bellingham area members have had for a few summers now. These events started as a get together for members to sit around and talk woodworking... to bring up a woodworking problem an individual may be having, and get suggestions how to approach the task. It morphed into an event to focus on a specific woodworking task, such as sharpening, where several members would bring their equipment and demonstrate how they approach the task.

The final topic that we discussed was how we might respond to several requests we've had from members, for the educational program to provide more 'advanced' classes. The requests were somewhat general, and in order to respond, we would appreciate some more specific guidance as to what you consider an 'advanced' class. Do you wish to see classes that focus project design, on advanced skills and techniques, or would larger and more involved projects be preferred? Are there things that you saw from previous club presentations, such as last month's speaker, Garrett Hack, that you would like to have some instruction in? Let us know specific skills, aspects of woodworking, or type of project, that you would like to see us offer!
