NCWA Committee Descriptions

Here's a description of the committees. The list is based on our activities of the past several years and is designed to both spread the load and to get everyone involved. The "minimum" number of members for each committee include the chairperson. More folks than the "minimum" can certainly be on a committee. The more the merrier.

Activities & Club Projects - minimum 2 members

There is always some unforeseen opportunity coming up that needs special attention. This committee will literally handle anything that isn't specifically addressed by one of the other committees. In addition, this committee will be responsible for the annual picnic and club history. Gary Weyers will be leading this committee in 2008.

Education - minimum 5 members

Education is the hallmark of NCWA. That, plus companionship, is the reason we are who we are. In prior years, we worked on the development of a specific education program for beginning woodworkers. The idea has gradually expanded to include programs to augment intermediate and advanced woodworking skills. The program will be refined in 2008 and modified to incorporate the experience we have gained through the years. The Committee will be responsible for the continued design, implementation and monitoring of specific education programs and will, of necessity, be coordinated with the monthly meeting program. Chuck Robertson has agreed to continue to chair this committee in 2008.

Tours & Visitations - minimum 2 members

Each year we have several tours, usually one to Vancouver to Lee Valley or other woodworking venues in the Vancouver area, one to Seattle to the annual woodworker's show and a resources trip to Seattle. It has also been suggested we try to arrange a couple joint meetings with other groups in the NW. This committee will be responsible for the organization of these events. Jay Geisel has agreed to chair this committee again in 2008.

Library - minimum 2 members

The library of tapes and books has now been organized and is ready to go. This committee will be responsible for maintaining the library, checking items out (and making sure they get back), making sure the members are aware of the materials and seeking additions via donations. Jim Torrence has agreed to chair this committee again in 2008.

Membership - minimum 5 members

This committee will be responsible for "marketing" our association, including developing and maintaining such tools as the brochure stands. It will also be responsible for "member relations" and keeping track of those who cannot attend regularly. It will also be responsible for membership cards. The Treasurer will continue to maintain the "official" membership list. Ed Pysher has agreed to chair this committee in 2008.

Newsletter - minimum 4 members

This committee's job pretty much speaks for itself. The committee is considering reorganization to include representatives in each of the basic geographic areas of our membership. Nick Van has agreed to take this substantial effort in 2008.

Monthly Program - minimum 5 members

This is a biggie, folks. We rise and fall on this one. Jim Bucknell has agreed to take this committee again, and he needs your help.

Public Shows - minimum 3 members

This committee is responsible for all the arrangements for the public shows in which we participate. In the past, we have participated in two shows and this committee will reevaluate this program to see if there are additional shows that would be appropriate and if the interest is there on the part of our members. Phil "Low Tech" Choquette has agreed to again chair this committee. He will be assisted by Nick Van, who will be concentrating on member participation in the two shows.

Toys For Tots - minimum 3 members

For the past three years, we've had a great project that contributes much to the community. It's the Toys For Tots program. This committee will be responsible for such projects as well as any building projects that would be helpful in the display of our talents at the various shows. Examples would be a rack to display the birdhouses and feeders, display tables, etc. Glenn Koontz has agreed to chair this committee in 2008.

Vendor Relations - minimum 2 membersis committee is responsible for maintaining a list of vendors that will offer discounts to NCWA members. This is a new function that will become effective in 2008. Larry Tomovick gave birth to this project in 2007 and will head the committee in 2008.

> NCWA donation to Toys for Tots was a feel-good, fit finale to all our activities and enjoyment.

> In a seasonal holiday pizza and salad pre-meeting dinner for more than 60 members and their spouses and guests, the delivery of 262 toys to the local Marine Corps Reserve was our big Hurrah! Our speaker was Past Marine Reservist Rick Crossley, Senior Coordinator of the Skagit Valley Detachment, No. 1043, Marine Corps League, who accepted the Club's toy donation and gave us a look into the history of the Toys for Tots program now celebrating its 60th Anniversary.

The program started in California when a Marine was handed a Christmas toy by his wife and told to give it to a children's charity. Not finding one, he addressed the issue with his local Marine Reserve group and this eventually led to the national program "Toys for Tots" The idea got interest from

Walt Disney who added his touch with the familiar toy train logo. The Marine Corps Reserve has been the official sponsor ever since. Locally, the Corps volunteers have refurbished a donated truck and use it year-around to pick up toys and warehouse them for distribution through various agencies at Christmas. This year their goal is to distribute 15,000 toys in their local area, which includes Skagit and Whatcom counties.

President Ed Pysher opened the ceremonies with an introduction of guests, greeted new members, and announced the slate of officers for 2008. Without nominations from the floor, the slate was voted unanimously, electing Vice President Walter Meyers to head the organization in 2008. Secretary Jay Geisel and Treasurer Doug Duehning retained their jobs, but the

Discounts Loom Big for 2008

With the New Year, Club members will begin to enjoy widespread savings on their purchases of tools and

woodworking materials, thanks largely to project chairman Larry Tomovick. (Please see pages 9 and 10 of this newsletter for а complete list of advertisers.) One of the persuasive perks of Club membership, discount shopping, is more valuable now because of a new advertising policy enacted by NCWA that offers merchants free business card presence in every issue of our Newsletter.

Tomovick, with help from his only committeeman, me, has tracked down various woodworking resources in Skagit and Whatcom counties to obtain retail discounts of 10%, or more, from members' preferred retailers. To date 13 merchants have agreed to grant significant savings

to us. Our approved sources are printed on two pages in the current issue and will be repeated each month.

> One of the best deals to come our way is being offered by catalog giant Hartville Tools in Ohio. Starting this month, Hartville will mail members their new catalog and an ID that will allow us to take a 20% discount off any listed item. The offer is good for one year. After that, the discount drops to 15%. Starting with the third year, Hartville will rebate to NCWA an amount equal to 3% of all purchases made by members throughout the year. This money can be used for prizes, awards or other Club purchases of catalog items. So. woodworkers, watch your mailbox for deals of a lifetime.

> We will add new resources to our advertising pages in the future. The start-up has

couple of our retail stores. Make sure you clarify your request by showing your NCWA Membership Card before completing your purchases. Also, for the present anyway, it would be a good practice to carry those printed advertising pages with you to show an uninformed sales clerk.

Western Tool has not responded to our requests for discounts, and, for the present, is not included in our free advertising program.

Not listed in this month's issue, **Steve Intveld** on Mount Baker Highway. Steve has always given fellow members a good deal on lumber purchases and is a highly desirable source for savings. He will join the advertisers' list next month.

Caveats exist. Some retailers are unable to offer discounts on items when prohibited to do so by certain manufacturers. And all will not further discount sale items. In rare cases discounts will not be offered on corded tools. Always check. Bob's Super Saw offers the lowest prices around for new saw blades and router bits. Although we are among their preferred customers, you may not always get further price cuts on these items. If you have any difficulty with our discounters please get in touch with Larry or a Club officer. - Jay

Discount Rules

Hardware Sales and Service

In order to received the discount from Hardware Sales & Service in Bellingham, members need to cite pin number '26959' or say they belong to the 'Northwest Corner Woodworkers.'

Hartsville Tool

Members should be receiving an email catalog from Hartville Tool fairly soon and this will give you information on how to order online to receive your 20% discount. The information can also be used when ordering merchandise over the telephone. When talking to customer service at Hartville, and giving your name, they will be able to identify you and the discount you're entitled to.

In the near future Hartville tool catalogs will be mailed to me and I will distribute them in the regular monthly meetings.

In addition to the 20% discount Hartville is offering free shipping for all orders placed before January 10, 2008.

As for those who did not provide an e-mail address to Hartville, I believe you'll be notified by mail. However if you don't hear anything, you are welcome to give them a call to verify your status. Their phone number is 800-345-2396.

Just remember, the 20% discount is only good for the first year and from then on the discount rate will be 15%. Note, this discount is not applicable towards sale

or clearance priced merchandise.

Upon completion of our second year of participation, we will receive a 3% rebate based on the total purchases made by our members. These rebates will take the form of gift certificates good toward any merchandise found in Hartsville's catalogue. - Larry
