Bring 'n Brag. Gary Weyers, Activities, lamented that there were only five entries in the Club's 2x4 contest, which concluded at the August picnic. However, he thought they were innovative and he expects a better showing next time. Gary showed two pieces that he made from his 2x4, one a general use box and the other a clever piano with an animated pianist.

George Smith explained how to use his thoughtful jig for making angled rip cuts on the table saw. His jig uses a system of strategically placed clamps on a long board to provide ideal wedge shaped cuts.

Jim Torrence has taken to music. Impressed by flutes made by native Americans, Jim has matched wits with native flute-makers and turned out several wooden beauties that can carry mellow sounds. His wood selections have been Western Cedar, Honduras Mahogany, and Hemlock. While he continues his search for the best material we are hopeful that he can learn some melodies and give us a concert at a future meeting

FastCap Puts on A Show.....

Wow! Freebies, discounts, and a raffle! Such things make grown woodworkers salivate We were introduced to FastCap, a burgeoning Bellingham tool manufacturer, by one of its most attractive promoter, Ellie Bird, who has enough personality to carry tough old workshop warriors through a catalog of products in a single hour. It was a demonstration that bordered on entertainment



With a table loaded with company products in front of her, Ellie introduced us to some very innovative and useful new woodworking tools that include a line of six different tape rule blade styles, chisels with folding handles that can be carried safely in your apron pocket, and FastCaps made of PVC, natural wood, or wood grain imitations that can cover screw heads, wood wounds, plumbing and electrical holes in the wall, and even Kreg-drilled openings. The latter adhesive-backed FastCaps are the flagship products that put the company in its prominent position as an innovative company. FastCap has taken promising inventions by various cabinetmakers and contractors and put them into production

Their catalog lists FastEdge peel and stick items for edgbanding wood products and the accessories to mke the job easy, such as their Flush Cut Trimmers to trim PVC edgbanding on solid wood, both sides at the same time with carbide cutters. Other aids are a custom color punch kit to make your own FastCaps with your own custom colors, a unique flushmount drill sysem that puts a hole in the wood surface just deep enough to sink the FastCap flush with the surface, and a line of SpeedTapes of different widths to apply a high performance, waterproof acrylic bond of adhesive. They also devised a SpeedRoller to apply pressure to the veneers and edgbanding.

Some of my favorites: Woody, a folding knife with a custom Pakka wood inlay. It's attractive, strong and carries a dual blade easily changed into a sharp, square-edged scraper. Also innovative are the line of safety glasses with plastic diopter lenses for those needing a little boost in their vision. Diopters of plus 1.5, 2.0, 2.5, and 3.0 are offered in a great looking "CatEyes" design. The GluBot that sucks is also from FastCap. They have two sizes and Jim



Bucknell really finds them useful with any gluing job, particularly when tackling large cabinets. A strong candidate for everyone's approval is the major improvement FastCap offers in dust masks, the MXV pocket dust mask distributed to all in attendance. The mask's protruding front keeps the material comfortably away from nose and face for a better fit. It's packaged in a zippered bag for pocket or apron and is reusable.

Ellie was quite the showman. She operated two battery drill/drivers, pounded mightily on the folded chisel handles, and did a quick-draw impersonation with a tape measure and pocket holder. The raffle was an enjoyable highlight that brought needed monies to our depleted treasury. And suitably, our Treasurer Doug Duhning won the big prize, a Professional Adhesive system package. Others won a selection of the company's measuring tapes, which have been awarded the "Best Tool of 2004." by American Woodworker magazine.

You can find the full line of FastCap products at Windsor Plywood and Hardware Sales in Bellingham. Both are ten percent discounters to NCWA members.

For those few that thought the program too commercialized, you have to remember that, as in television, advertising powers free entertainment. —JG

aligned and at the same height. The class will be held at Gary's shop in Burlington.
