October's Secretary Report It's Back to School Time for NCWA Woodworkers, too.

Probably our largest attendance ever greeted President John Bellinger as he asked guests to introduce themselves at the October meeting. Upward of 100 woodworkers gathered at Hillcrest Park Lodge to welcome the start of the Fall season and a new round of classes that will continue until Spring 2013.

Class attendance got off to a fast start with a dozen members filling the first Saturday session on Wood Treatment and Preparation. The class was instructed by Phil Choquette and held at Jerry Anderson's shop on Saturday morning, October 13th. The class was over-filled while other courses are piling up registrants rapidly as NCWA membership continues to grow.

Participation was the key to this meeting. We had a strong response to our 2x4 challenge, our second foray into this type of membership activity. The Bring 'n Brag exhibit was also great.

In November we will meet for the traditional annual Toys for Tots special dinner and meeting with the local U. S. Marine Reserve Detachment to make our official donation. The big truck will be at the meeting again to pick up the hundreds of toys members have made during the year. Bill Baer who chairs this committee will be in charge of activities. Also in November we will see the slate of NCWA officers nominated for 2013. Balloting is in December. Also on the horizon: it will soon be time to reup your membership for the coming year.

Chairman Jerry Anderson does a great job managing classes and keeping track of registrations and fees. Instructors are asked to now give a brief description of their classes at the meeting before their scheduled class.
