OCTOBER 7TH GREG KLASSEN FURNITURE

Greg Klassen made a definite career path change several years ago when he switched from theology to fine woodworking. When he did, he went all out by studying at the School of the Redwoods and with two furniture masters in Sweden. He now creates one of a kind pieces under commission from his shop in Lynden. His work has won awards, been featured in several national magazines including Fine Woodworking, and was included at the 2013 Smithsonian Craft Show where he was interviewed and praised by Martha Stewart on national TV. Greg will demonstrate one of his techniques for inlaying custom non-uniform butterfly keys using router and chisels. He will also bring several of his recent pieces to show and talk about. WOODTURNER RICK ANDERSON

Rick Anderson gave a great turning demonstration. He started with an excellent comprehensive safety demonstration that made everyone a little more sensitive to the dangers of the lathe. Rick, talking as he worked, went over the difference in gouges and skewers and

what was the best technique for using them. Rick showed how to make a spindle out of white oak and also demonstrated how to turn a Shaker Knob. The program, including close ups of Rick's cutting technique, were projected on the screen



and made the instruction easy to observe and follow. Rick finished by encouraging people to join the Northwest Washington Wood turners Club(<http://www.nwwwt.org>) and also to learn how to sharpen tools to be an effective turner.

BRING AND BRAG

Steve Durkee displayed two beautiful inlaid wall hangings of maple, pecan, basswood, and Masonite hardboard.

Nancy Anderson showed a scrollwork maple perfume tray that had 470 inside cuts. It was truly an impressive piece of scrollwork.

Dave Blair had turned a spalted figured alder wooden bowl and finished it with walnut oil.

Norman Grossman, a new member, displayed an exquisite tantalus (liquor cabinet) made from babinga with inlaid ebony and scrimshawed fossilized ivory decorative medallions.



Greg Koenker showed a spectacular quilted maple and sapele media cabinet that was finished with wipe on gloss polyurethane.

Charley Drake shared a chip carved butternut pencil holder finished with stain and polyurethane. Charley worked this in Wayne Barton's class and was very enthusiastic about it. Charley also used chip carving to produce a very nice basswood frame.

Chuck Robertson had a couple of very nice router made asymmetric bowls finished with polyurethane


Gary Weyers had made a beer mug (as his weren't big enough) with a scroll saw. Neat idea for the beer drinkers. Thanks, Gary!



BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES

September 10, 2014

President Don Wilkins convened the meeting at 7:00 P.M.

Members Present: Tim Wynn, Bill Baer, Ed Pyscher, Bill Rawls, Don Wilkins, Al Ashley, Andrew Pellar, David Shull, Philip Choquette

No comments or corrections were made on the minutes of the last meeting.

Treasurer Report. Al Ashley reported that the club had \$5387.74 on hand in checking and savings accounts. He also reported that the club had a total membership of 170 at this point with 32 new members joining this year. The picnic cost \$478.84 but \$239.42 will be reimbursed by the Turner's club. The Toys-4-Tots raffle netted \$372.00 (Thanks, Jerry, for the great boxes). Getting the boxes to the raffle winners has proved to be quite challenging. One winner in Mt. Vernon has not returned calls or responded to a letter sent by Al Ashley. After some discussion, Ed Physer moved and Bill Baer seconded a motion to draw another winner for the raffle if no response is received from the letter. The motion passed unanimously. We have also had \$39 in miscellaneous donations to the Toys-4-Tots. Greg Klassen will be giving the program in October and we will be giving him a \$200 honorarium.

Bill Baer indicated he would be resigning from the Board in January 2015.

Geary Greenleaf has resigned from the Board for health reasons. The Board wishes him well and thanks him for his service to NCWA. He will be missed.

The Board agreed to kick off the annual membership renewal drive in October.

Andrew Pellar suggested a toy building participation station at the next Mall show and Woodfest. The consensus of the Board was that this was a good idea and that we should look for a chairman to manage the effort at the next General Meeting.

Andrew indicated that Garrett Hack might potentially be available for a program next September. It was agreed that the program committee should explore this option further.

President Don Wilkins adjourned the meeting at 7:50 P.M.
