NCWA General Meeting Notes October 4, 2016

- President Charley Drake convened the meeting at 7:00 p.m. at the Hillcrest Lodge in Mt. Vernon, WA.
- Membership Committee. Tim Wynn indicated that he still had a lot of 2016 Membership cards to distribute. Check with him at the back of the room.
- Treasurer. Al Ashley indicated that he had started collecting dues for Calendar Year 2017. Dues are still only \$30 which makes the NCWA the best financial deal in the area.
- Programs Committee.
 - Charley Drake indicated that the Shop Tour would be on October 15 in Anacortes. (Ed. Note – the tour was subsequently cancelled because of the threat of severe weather. It will be rescheduled)
 - Jay Smith will conduct a program on Viking Boat Building on October 22. See the signup list in the back of the room.
 - November Program will be Toys for Tots as well as Nominations for Association Officers. (See below)
 - The LaConner Arts Alive Festival will be on November 5 & 6. See Charley to sign up to help.
- Bring & Brag.
 - George Knutson displayed some nesting tables which used a variety of mortise and tenon joints. George plans to use the tables in a class he is giving on mortise and tenon joints. The tables were made out of African mahogany and figured Sapele. It was finished with conversion varnish over a dye stain. Very nicely done, George.
 - Ben Gage showed us another beautiful platter assembled from over 100 pieces of walnut and maple. It was finished with a wipe on polyurethane. Awesome as usual, Ben.
 - Greg Koenker presented a beautiful routed box made out of Sapele and Brazilian Monkey Pod. It was finished with Polyurethane.
 - Dennis Lindsay showed us an exquisite hand cut dovetail box with diamond figured inlays. It was made out of Alder and Oak and finished with a wipe on polyurethane over a 3 way oil mix.
 - Tom Howorth showed us a handy storage unit for his Worksharp 3000. It was made out of plywood and walnut and finished with walnut oil.
 - Jay Geisel showed us a box he had made in Jim Bucknell's class. He had added a deer horn handle to it. Good job, Jay.
 - Jim Bucknell showed us another one of his exquisite boxes. It was constructed out of ebonized walnut and figured maple. It was finished with polyurethane.
 - Phil Humphries displayed another one of his nested bandsaw boxes. It was made out of ash and Sapele. It was finished with an oil mix of Tung, polyurethane and boiled linseed oil. So when are you going to teach a class, Phil?
 - Val Matthews showed us a wooden plane that he had constructed out of white oak and Paduk. Finished with Profin, it was an example of the plane that will be built in his next class. Beautiful piece of work, Val.
 - Norm Smith displayed a truly unique 'over-sink' cutting board made out of maple, walnut and cherry. It had been saturated in spar varnish and then sanded to 4000 grit. It was really amazing.
- Tom Thornton was the raffle winner of a Lee Valley Block Plane. Congratulations, Tom.
- John Miller from Cascade Joinery gave us a soup to nuts tour of his operations via a slide show. It was very impressive. For those of you who missed it, John gave us a glimpse into the process by which some of the most elaborate exposed timber structures are designed, fabricated and erected. The program was a tour de force highlighted by pictures of the spectacular structures that they have erected over the past several years. We are very grateful for John for sharing his expertise with us.






