Charley will demonstrate his Belgium-made, Robland X-31 multi-purpose machine he has in his shop. If you've attended previous shop tours, or have visited Charley's shop (yeah, the one with the glass roll-up doors and incredible view!), you've probably seen and been intrigued at the potential capabilities of this tool. Charley will demonstrate this machine focusing on the jointer/planer/horizontal mortising features.

Next up, Greg Robinson will provide examples of projects that were designed on a computer and, with the aid of CNC technology, brought into the real world. Included will be a short video demonstrating the accuracy of a well-tuned CNC router.

Woodworking, like just about everything in life, is constantly evolving. For the woodworker, technology and tool advancements can have a place in the shop, just as traditional hand tools do. This promises to be an enlightening presentation, and our thanks to Charley and Greg for their willingness to share these tools with us.

How to Access ZOOM for October 6th Meeting

As a refresher...a couple of tips and/or things to be aware of for Zoom meetings...

At 6:30 PM the Zoom host (King Dahl) will mute everyone's microphones. This will eliminate background noise that can come over your mic inadvertently, even if you are not speaking.

There are two buttons to be aware of at the bottom of your screen - the Participants Button and the Chat Button. Depending on whether you are using a Mac, PC, iPad, iPhone, or other device, the buttons may be in slightly different locations.

Clicking the Participants Button allows you to view a list of all NCWA members that have joined the Zoom meeting. It also allows you to click a button to "Raise your hand" if you'd like to be unmuted to speak or ask a question. Using this "Raise your hand" feature helps avoid confusion and the potential of people talking over each other.

The Chat Button allows you to chat/text to a specific person during the meeting, privately, or you can send a message to everyone in attendance. Anytime during the presentation, if you have a question for the presenter, **Chat it to NCWA Wood (that goes to the host, King Dahl)** and he will forward it to the presenter at the appropriate time. We will do our best to get as many questions answered as possible.

Lastly, if for any reason, your internet drops you from the meeting, re-click the invitation link to re-join. Everyone's internet service is a bit different, with some better than others, so we hope your service will allow a pleasant viewing and participatory experience for you.

Bill Pearce - Library– Asked for a \$450 budget to help with the shipping expenses for getting library materials to members upon requests. The Library's past budget has been \$400 for new books and materials. In Oct & Nov we will offer free shipping to members who would like to check out books and DVDs.

Greg – Education Committee- The education committee is requesting \$600 to use to purchase new equipment to make videos and recordings for our clubs online access.

\$400 for a GoPro camera and \$200 to go towards materials needed for future demos and VST (Virtual Shop Tour) Projects. The Education Committee would also like to promote the Classes we have by raffling off the project being made to one of the class participants at the end of the class. Our club seems to have about 50% participation and we have been working towards increasing that.

Stratigic Planning

Past location was small with bad acoustics and lighting and no storage space - We have since found a new venue that has adequate space, parking, coffee and a kitchen area along with plenty of lights, great audio video equipment, comfy chairs and even a little storage space.

There was much discussion on how to get more members involved and how to encourage new members to join a committee and meet members right away when joining.

There was also mention of having neighborhood group meet ups so members can meet the other members that live close to them. There is a woodworkers club in New Hampshire that has a fabulous website and takes a regional approach to having smaller meetings so members can be more active with their fellow club members. Then they have quarterly meetings for all members to gather in one location. With our club members spread out over many counties and hours of driving it would be encouraging to see them meeting in smaller groups to keep woodworking active in their area.

It was suggested to use a New Member Committee to help welcome new folks and introduce them to other members in their area. Maybe connect them with mentors and encourage them to join a committee to get them more involved and excited about the clubs happenings.

A few members agreed to work toward creating a map that would show us locations of each member in our community. Then maybe with the resource we can help get smaller group meetings instigated.
