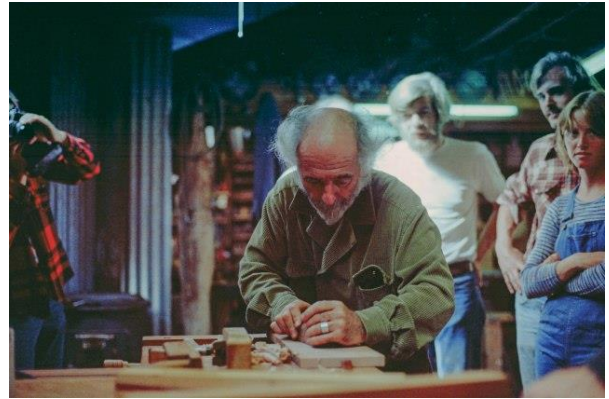

After learning cabinetmaking from his father (and a stint in academia designing and researching musical instruments) he attended College of the Redwoods (now The Krenov School) where he honed his talents as a designer and maker of fine furniture.

Since attending school, Brendan has worn the hats of toolmaker, teacher, writer and furnituremaker, building everything from ancient rulers, geometer’s tools, gallery furniture and greenwood chairs, with his work published in *Popular Woodworking* and *Mortise and Tenon* magazines.

Brendan’s presentation will be on his biography of James Krenov to be published by Lost Art Press in 2020.

How to Access ZOOM for January 5th Meeting

Thanks to those of you who have been attending the Zoom Meetings . The feedback has been excellent, and building on that momentum, we look forward to another wonderful virtual presentation this month.

The January meeting will be our regular schedule with a short business meeting, including Bring & Brag, followed by the presentation.

Prior to the meeting, **NCWA members are welcomed to login to Zoom beginning at 6:30 PM** to allow some time for those wanting or needing to get familiar with the Zoom format before **the meeting begins at 7:00 PM.**

The invitation to join details were/will be sent to you in a separate email

As a refresher...a couple of tips and/or things to be aware of for Zoom meetings...

At 6:30 PM the Zoom host (King Dahl) will mute everyone's microphones. This will eliminate background noise that can come over your mic inadvertently, even if you are not speaking.

There are two buttons to be aware of at the bottom of your screen - the Participants Button and the Chat Button. Depending on whether you are using a Mac, PC, iPad, iPhone, or other device, the buttons may be in slightly different locations.

Clicking the Participants Button allows you to view a list of all NCWA members that have joined the Zoom meeting. It also allows you to click a button to "Raise your hand" if you'd like to be unmuted to speak or ask a question. Using this "Raise your hand" feature helps avoid confusion and the potential of people talking over each other.

The Chat Button allows you to chat/text to a specific person during the meeting, privately, or you can send a message to everyone in attendance. Anytime during the presentation, if you have a question for the presenter, **Chat it to NCWA Wood (that goes to the host, King Dahl)** and he will forward it to the presenter at the appropriate time. We will do our best to get as many questions answered as possible.

Lastly, if for any reason, your internet drops you from the meeting, re-click the invitation link to re-join. Everyone's internet service is a bit different, with some better than others, so we hope your service will allow a pleasant viewing and participatory experience for you.

NCWA Board of Directors Meeting

December 9, 2020

The meeting was convened at 7:00 PM by President Jim Bucknell, using Zoom.

- Members present included: Jim Bucknell, King Dahl, Al Ashley, George Knutson, George Lanphear, Sascha Vandette, David Vandette, John Braun, Phil Humphries, Jim Hickey, Richard Gillingham, Greg Koenker, Jim Ferguson
- Treasurer's Report:
 - NCWA has a total of \$13,343.94 in checking, savings and PayPal accounts.
 - Prior year \$10,206.63.
 - Membership as of 12/09/2020 - 239.
 - Prior year 226.
 - New Members 2020 – 26.
 - Honorary Members – 6.
 - Dues collected for 2021.
 - 100 members – PayPal. 31 – Personal check. (total 56%)
 - Refunds for members who paid dues twice on PayPal:
 - Discussion of whether to refund \$35.00 or reduce refund by \$1.32 PayPal transaction fee. This only affects a small number of members. Motion was made and seconded to refund full \$35.00. Motion passed.
 - Status of Honorary members.
 - Current practice is to provide Honorary (free) 1-year membership to presenters. Question was raised about billing for membership after 1 year. After discussion, George Knutson moved that the Honorary memberships be discontinued. Seconded by King Dahl and passed by majority.
- King Dahl brought up ZOOM charges, should we stay at 100 participants level or move to higher tier of 500. This was discussed and agreed to stay at 100 level for now.
 - NCWA now has the ability to have more than one host for Zoom meetings so other members can now host meetings. King DaHL can provide information about using ZOOM for committee meetings. etc.
- Education Committee.
 - No classes scheduled at this time.
 - Jim Bucknell moved, and George Knutson seconded, to have the Education Committee develop directions/criteria for VST/U-Tube presentations produced by members. Motion passed by majority.
 - Discussion regarding VST/U-Tube posting on internet developed into a three-part discussion:
 - Should the club include a disclaimer regarding safety and liability on items posted to U-Tube?
 - Should presenters be given the choice to not have videos posted?
 - Should the club institute a password to limit access to the U-Tube channel.
 - Motion was made, modified and seconded to vote:
 - Yes, to disclaimer.
 - Yes, to presenters having the choice to have items posted on U-Tube.

NCWA on YouTube

A new club YouTube Channel has been launched so that our digital Virtual Shop Talks can be accessed easily for club members that missed a VST session, or for repeated watching for reference.

As the pandemic drags on for a few more months making it likely it will be a while before we are able to meet again in person, we will also record the informative presentation portion of our monthly meetings for re-viewing at your leisure.

We understand this does not replace the camaraderie that only face-to-face gatherings provide, but we hope that members find these short presentation films helpful in their quest to further their woodworking skills.

There are currently SEVEN NCWA videos on the YouTube Channel and more added each month.

 - Motion was put to a vote and passed by majority.
- Library committee.
 - Sale of excess items postponed due to COVID-19.
 - Expect to continue Mail and drop off program
 - Committee has approximately \$150.00 in budget to purchase new items for library.
- Membership Roster photos:
 - Richard Gillingham reported on program to add member photos to the roster. It currently looks like this will increased roster from 13 pages to approximately 33 pages.
- Jim Bucknell brought up a possible project to build student desks and make them available for students doing remote schooling.
 - There are several questions, including:
 - How do we decide who would be eligible for a desk?
 - Donate vs. sell to family?
 - Can we get crowd source funding for a project like this?
 - Do we want to take this on?
 - Jim agreed to pursue this for now as a possible community resource project.
- Phil Humphries brought up a question regarding first aid kits for use in a woodworking shop. Can we develop a recommended list of items that could be included in a shop first aid kit? This was left as an open item.
- Al Ashley asked about the status of the monthly newsletter. Status is not changed, Jane will continue to produce an exceptional product monthly.
- There are two positions open on the Board for Board Member at Large. Sasha Vandette and George Knutson have agreed to fill those positions. Thanks to both for stepping up.
- Meeting was adjourned at 9:00 PM
