Michael Dresdner

Our April presentation will be on Wipe On Finishes, Old and New, with nationally known finishing and woodworking expert, Michael Dresdner. We all strive to find that finish that's 1)effective, 2)easy to apply, 3)doesn't take a lot of time to apply, and 4)is easy to clean up afterward. Michael will show us several options that've proven themselves over time (and why), and he'll also talk about some of the newer wipe on finishes that we're seeing in the woodworking stores, and on our Bring and Brag projects! Time permitting, he'll field questions on finishing problems you need help with. Don't miss it!



Background on Michael Dresdner:

Michael Dresdner has written 4 books and created numerous videos and dvd's on finishing and finishing fixes. He was a contributing editor for Fine Woodworking, American Woodworker, and Woodworkers' Journal. He also spent quite a few years as a technical resource for several finish manufacturers, due to his extensive background in chemistry. On top of all that, he's been a luthier for over 40 years, designing and building electric and acoustical instruments. He served as Director of Research & Development for Martin Guitars, and was founding CEO of Tacoma Guitar Co. Currently, he operates Rainy Day Ukes, where he builds "green" ukuleles, using exclusively local materials and environmentally friendly construction methods.

It's hard to believe we've passed the 1 year anniversary of the Coronavirus Pandemic hitting Washington state. A lot has changed in all of our lives, but I am grateful that we've been able to keep engaged with each other, and share our love of woodworking, even if it is by virtue of our computer screens, for the most part.

The board is also anxious to announce when we will be returning to our in-person monthly meetings, but it is still too early to make that determination. Hopefully, as more and more people are vaccinated, life will return to some semblance of normalcy in the coming few months. And we look forward to combining some of the Zoom technology in this regard, even after we return to in person meetings.

That being said, Phil Humphries, the club's Program's Chair, who I think we can all agree is doing a fantastic job at arranging very interesting and diverse presentations for us all, is asking for your input and suggestions for upcoming presentation topics. One last word about our monthly meetings...in an effort to keep our meetings at the usual 2-hour length, I am going to do my best to help moderate the timing a bit better. How to Access ZOOM for April 6th Meeting

Thanks to those of you who have been attending the Zoom Meetings . The feedback has been excellent, and building on that momentum, we look forward to another wonderful virtual presentation this month.

The April meeting will follow regular schedule with a business meeting, Bring & Brag, and presentation.

NCWA members are welcomed to login to Zoom beginning at 6:30 PM to allow some time for those wanting or needing to get familiar with the Zoom format before the meeting begins at 7:00 PM.

The invitation to join details were/will be sent to you in a separate email

As a refresher...a couple of things to be aware of for Zoom meetings...

At 6:30 PM the Zoom host (King Dahl) will mute everyone's microphones. This will eliminate background noise that can come over your mic inadvertently, even if you are not speaking.

There are two buttons at the bottom of your screen - the Participants Button and the Chat Button. Depending on whether you are using a Mac, PC, iPad, iPhone, or other device, the buttons may be in slightly different locations.

Clicking the Participants Button allows you to view a list of all NCWA members that have joined the Zoom meeting. It also allows you to click a button to "Raise your hand" if you'd like to be unmuted to speak or ask a question. Using this "Raise your hand" feature helps avoid confusion and the potential of people talking over each other.

The Chat Button allows you to chat/text to a specific person during the meeting, privately, or you can send a message to everyone in attendance. Anytime during the presentation, if you have a question for the presenter, **Chat it to NCWA Wood** (that goes to the host, King Dahl) and he will forward it to the presenter at the appropriate time. We will do our best to get as many questions answered as possible.

Lastly, if for any reason, your internet drops you from the meeting, re-click the invitation link to re-join. Everyone's internet service is a bit different, with some better than others, so we hope your service will allow a pleasant viewing and participatory experience for you.

NCWA Board of Directors Meeting

NCWA Board of Directors Meeting MARCH 10, 2021

Meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by King Dahl, President. Members present (on ZOOM) were King Dahl, Greg Koenker, Al Ashley, George Lanphear, Jim Bucknell, George Knutson, Phil Humphries, Jim Hickey, David and Sasha Vandette, and Bill Pierce.

Treasurer's Report. Al Ashley reported the financial status of the Association. Details are available in his report, which was submitted to the Board by email.

Membership as of 3/10/21 - 202 (prior year - 228)

Members not renewing for 2021 - 41 (prior year – 20)

New members 2021 YTD - 8 (prior year - 15)

Update on authorized signers on our bank account at Banner Bank; this was completed by Al Ashley on 3/1/21.

Question was raised regarding an honorary membership for Jane Wynn. As discussed at February's Board meeting, the board is in agreement that Jane should be awarded an Honorary membership. Motion was made, seconded and passed by majority vote that Jane Wynn will be an Honorary member. Al Ashley will record this in the membership rolls and King Dahl will personally notify Jane of this action.

Programs Committee. Phil Humphries. Discussion of upcoming Presenters for monthly meetings. To provide Phil with added input from members, it was agreed that a link could be added to the newsletter giving members an easy way to offer suggestions for presentation topics and presenters.

Education Committee. Greg Koenker updated VST program. There was discussion about future use of the VST programs, particularly when in person meetings and classes resume. This will be an ongoing discussion item. The general consensus being that the VST format can be useful for things like an introduction to "hands on" classes and other topics of interest.

Greg brought up the concept of having a Technology Sub-Committee to work on issues that come up producing VSTs and presentations, ZOOM issues, etc. This will continue to be looked at. Greg is working with Tony Etienne developing an on-line Forum program to share questions and answers. This looks like it is close to a testing phase.

Library Committee. Bill Pierce reported on the library program. There was a suggestion made that perhaps the Library should have a process in place to acquire a copy of books written by Presenters relevant to their presentations. This may be addressed on a case by case basis.

Additionally, the Library Committee is requesting additional funds to support the check out by mail process. A motion was made to add \$200.00 to the Library budget for 2021. Seconded and passed by majority vote.

Other business:

The rocking horse donated by Sherri Greenleaf was picked up and is being cared for by George Knutson pending a decision on how it will be used.

Discussion of when we may be comfortable hosting in person meetings and participate in functions such as the Anacortes Arts Festival. Obviously depends on multiple factors.

Anacortes Arts Festival. Based on the uncertainty of the Festival occurring this year, the personnel commitment required, health risk to members participating and other factors; a motion was made, seconded and passed by majority that NCWA would not participate this year. There is agreement that this decision should be announced in the next Newsletter.

In person meetings and classes. These will be open items for further discussion. One idea is we plan the annual picnic later this summer (possibly September). Assuming that most members will have been vaccinated by then, an open air activity could be a good way to resume in-person activities.

Monthly Zoom meetings length and format. Discussion of a number of issues. Included, length of presentations, changing meeting starting time, limiting Bring & Brag, changing the order of events and other ways to "tighten up" the meetings. Consensus is to start by working with presenters to emphasize time expectations and generally keep the meetings on track and on topic.

Bring & Brag limitations. Part of the discussion about length of the meetings. Suggestions included limiting the number of items members could show, limiting the number of photos members can submit, limiting the number of members who could display their projects. One suggestion that Greg Koenker is looking into is to take advantage of the process of members submitting photos prior to the meeting to produce a Bring & Brag slide show.

Newsletter format/layout. Al Ashley made a suggestion that the newsletter have a more standardized format. He agreed to work with Jane Wynn on this.

Meeting was adjourned shortly after 9:00 PM.
