Sometimes when life knocks you off your feet, you find yourself in a surprisingly happy place when you pick yourself back up. Such is the case with furniture maker Jeff Miller. Most woodworkers know Jeff's name through his many



articles, books and videos for *Fine Woodworking, Popular Woodworking* and *Wood Magazine*. (He also has upcoming articles in *Mortise & Tenon* and *Furniture & Cabinetmaking*.) Jeff has taught at woodworking schools across the United States, from the Northwest Woodworking Studio and Port Townsend School of Woodworking on the west coast to the Center for Furniture Craftsmanship on the east, and others – Red Rocks in Colorado, Marc Adams in Indiana, Kelly Mehler's School of Woodworking in central Kentucky (now Pine Croft) and Highland Woodworking in Georgia. He has presented at Woodworking in America, Weekend with Wood and the Association of Woodworking and Finishing Suppliers, and at more clubs and

guilds than he can easily call to mind. He has won numerous awards for his woodworking, among them the Distinguished Furniture Design Award from the Chicago Athenaeum Museum, and for his publications, including the Stanley Golden Hammer Award for his 1997 book "Chairmaking & Design." The Chicago History Museum has Jeff's "Spider Handkerchief Table" in its permanent collection. And you will soon find his work on the prestigious back cover of *Fine Woodworking* magazine.

Bring & Brag Highlights

July Bring and Brag

Jerry Couchman-

Project- Floor lamp built as a first house housewarming gift for his daughter. Inspired by a table lamp he built and donated to the Interfaith Coalition (first photo) fundraiser. Woods used are: Sapele for the frame with book matched figured maple panels, ebony trim on top, and a stained glass shade made by his brother-in-law. Finish: two coats of Osmo 3043. Another great piece, Jerry!

Stan Creighton-

Project: Keepsake box for his daughter......hmmm, there seems to be a theme here. Woods used: Big Leaf Maple for the box, Koa veneer for the lid inlay and tray bottoms, and regular Koa for the trays, handle, and feet. He got his wood from Hardwoods To Get, in Bellingham. Finish: 3 coats of boiled linseed oil, 3 coats of oil/varnish, then wax. The grain pattern changes as the lighting hits it from different angles! Stan used ideas he learned from a couple recent presentations on finishing and coloring woods, and he found a great combination. Thanks for sharing your tips and the result of your lessons learned.

Tom Howorth-

The first project is a cutting board commission. It's 11x14x1" made of end grain maple. The inlay background is padauk, and the silhouettes are holly. The customer wanted a lightweight board for camping that included her dogs. He made the inlays from photos of the customer's two dogs and the feather represents a dog she lost. The inlays and juice groove were made using his CNC. It's finished with cutting board oil and wax. Tom's work is shown below.

The second project is some simple salad tongs. He had a pair that an uncle had made for he and his wife, but they broke. So Tom made two new ones using quartersawn oak, finished with walnut oil and wax. Useful projects are always fun projects!!

Roger Shimer-

Project: platform bed frame. The woods used are Red Oak and Birch Ply (from Windsor). Finished with Spring Oak oil stain, and 3 coats of waterbased poly. Projects like this, with multiple slats that need to be evenly spaced can be challenging. Roger clearly rose to the occasion. Great job, Roger!!

Below is the information for the first class being offered... watch your email for announcements of other coming classes.

This class is offered for those NCWA club members that have been fully vaccinated for COVID-19, and will be conducted in a manner consistent with currently recommended CDC guidelines. Wearing masks is not required. As with all NCWA classes, attendance is voluntary, and it is requested that your personal level of comfort dictate your decision to attend.

Course Title: Table Saw Maintenance

Instructor: Charley Drake

Date: Saturday, August 21st from 9 am - 4 pm

Location: Bob Doop's shop

Maximum number of class slots: 4 (fully vaccinated!)

Additional instructions: Plan to bring lunch (or run into town if you prefer). Please bring gloves, safety glasses, and wear work clothes.

Course Description: For this class we will take a Powermatic table saw apart. We will clean all the mating machined surfaces, dry them and lubricate them. We will check bearings for wear, replace the drive belts, clean the electronics and check for wear and overheating. When we are done the elevation and angle controls will work easily and lock into the setting we want. The miter slots will align with the table saw blade. The fence will line up with the blade precisely. The only thing I don't plan to do is paint the saw. The class will take place in Bob Doop's shop, located in Anacortes. Bob is a founding member of the club. When we are done Bob's saw should be good as new and you will have the chance to learn a lot about machine maintenance.

NCWA Minutes of the Board of Directors Meeting July 14, 2021

Meeting was called to order at 7:02PM.

- 1. Treasurer's Report (Al Ashley). A copy of the complete Treasurer's Report has been sent by email to all Board members.
 - Total members as of 7/13/21 214 (prior year 230)
 - New members 2021 YTD 18 (prior year 17
 - PayPal fees increasing 8/2/21. This will increase our cost per \$35.00 membership charged using PayPal from \$1.32 to \$1.40.
- 2. Education Committee (Greg Koenker). Update on VSTs and in-person classes. A motion was made and passed to restart in person classes in August 2021. Greg will coordinate a schedule of upcoming classes for the Newsletter, to include a statement about Covid rules and how individual instructors may choose to be more cautious than basic CDC guidelines, etc.
- 3. Presentations Committee (Phil Humphries). August- Jeff Miller, September George Knutson.
- 4. Discussion of returning to in-person meetings (King Dahl) A motion was made and passed to NOT hold in-person meetings for the remainder of this year. (The picnic is not considered a monthly meeting). King is going to have this included in the Newsletter, explaining that we have made this decision to be cautious rather than risk infection, etc.
- 5. King brought up an error or conflict in the July Newsletter. This has been identified and will be addressed in the August newsletter.

6. Picnic (King Dahl and the Board):

- a) Start and end time: 1:00 PM to 4:00 PM. This will be published with a notation that individuals planning to participate in the Tool Sale may arrive early to set up their display and fill out Silent Auction form(s).
- b) Payment for the Venue: Brannon Mucke informed us that the Christian School is not charging us for the use of the facility.
- c) Covid Protocols:
 - Per CDC guidelines, masks optional if vaccinated, Etc.
 - Contact tracing. Sign in sheet with members and guests given sticker "meal ticket". Sign in name and membership number.
 - Masks and hand sanitizer will be available
- d) Grill rental. Sascha Vandette will coordinate, Richard Gillingham will pick-up and return the grill, along with other items such as tables, canopies, coolers.
- e) Food and supplies purchasing. George Knutson and King Dahl will make a Costco run.
- f) Food prep. Identified a need for at least 1 person to slice tomatoes, lettuce, and onions the morning of the picnic. Brannon Mucke said that the kitchen area of the school will be available for this if we need to use it. Also, we will need at least 4 people to do the cooking, working in shifts. One final position would be someone to manage the condiments, refilling and replacing as needed.
- g) Tables for pot luck dishes, tool sale, book sale. Tables can be moved outside from the school. Also, several individuals have folding tables that they will be bringing.
- h) Coolers. Several individuals volunteered to bring coolers for food storage. Brannon will check that the ice machine at the school is on and available. Worst case someone will need to make a trip to pick up several bags of ice.
- i) Set up and tear down. Several Board members volunteered or were volunteered for this. Trash will be bagged and can be placed in a dumpster on the school grounds.
- j) Alcohol. BYO, we will ask anyone who brings beer or wine for their own consumption to be discrete, i.e. use a "Red Solo Cup" since we are on the school grounds.
- k) Tool sale format. Silent Auction. George Lanphear volunteered to manage this. Sellers will be responsible for set up of their display items and filling out a form. A "last call" announcement will be made approximately 2:45 PM and results will be finalized beginning at 3:00PM.
- l) Book Sale. Sales will be held until 3:00 PM.
- m) Estimated attendance. Richard Gillingham will contact Al Ashley to send an email out to all members asking for an RSVP. Hopefully we can get a more accurate expectation from this.
