

The most interesting part of this bowl is the rim that has a repetitive chip carved design along it. It almost takes on a Scandinavian look.

Submitted by David Shull: A pair of spalted birch bowls, made from the trunk of a birch tree given to him by an NCWA club member.



Submitted by Christina Keenan: I designed this to serve as a printer stand, with printer on top and supplies just below it. The wood is pine, with Benite treatment, teak stain and polyurethane coating. It has an open, minimalist look for style and functional reasons: the bottom shelf will hold a large HEPA air cleaner which needs unrestricted air flow around it.

I want to thank two of our members for their help. Stuart Welch cut the wood to my specifications, but added the interlocking feature between the uprights and the shelves which not only looks better but made fitting the pieces together easy. George Knutson helped me to stabilize the stand which originally shook like an earthquake when I'd print anything... a problem I hadn't anticipated when I designed it. (Oops!) Stuart's and George's creative efforts took significant time out of their schedules, and I am thankful to both of them.





Submitted by George Lanphear: Here is a photo of my Rocking Unicorn. Made from common 2" x 6" fir and 1" x 6" pine. Saddle is from a chunk of 8/4 cherry resawn to 3/8". Finished with poly acrylic.

Richard will advise you if the item(s) are available or currently out. If the item(s) are still available, we will have the items you requested in a bag with your name on it waiting for you at the next monthly meeting. You will have until 7pm the day before the meeting to request items for that meeting.


To accommodate uncertainty around attending in-person meetings, we are extending the checkout period to **3 months**.

### **Meeting Minutes**

#### **Minutes of General Membership Meeting**

#### October 4, 2022

This meeting was intended to be presented as a hybrid Zoom and in-person meeting from the Mt. Vernon Christian School. Unfortunately, due to technical issues the Zoom portion did not work out as expected.

The meeting was called to order shortly after 7:00 PM.

Treasurer's report (Al Ashley). Al reported no significant changes to our financials. Al also mentioned that dues for 2023 are remaining at \$35.00 and are being accepted via cash (at meetings), check (at meetings or by mail) and Pay Pal. Check the Newsletter for further information.

Many of the Committee Chairpersons were not in attendance, and most Committee reports were omitted.

Bring & Brag. Tom Napier brought a Lazy Susan made of Walnut, Maple and Cherry strips. This was an example of several that Tom had made for family. The strips had been glued up into 2' X 2' blocks, cut to circles and edge rounded with a router.

George Lanphear displayed a "Rocking Unicorn" built using common pine and fir lumber. A saddle was made from a piece of cherry resawn to ¼" thickness and glued on.

Peter Gantt had carved a bowl with detailed edgework out of cherry.

David Steel had made a "Stool Sample" as a gag gift for his doctor. Wood type(s) unknown.

David Schull showed two turned bowls made of Spalted Birch.

The remainder of the meeting was turned over to our guest speaker, Alex Dolese of Dolese Woodworks. Alex gave a talk about how she got started as a woodworker and subsequently grew that into a successful business in Bozeman, MT.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> (Al Ashley) Al had sent copies of the monthly report and the proposed budget for 2023 to all board members via email prior to the meeting.

The monthly report was covered with no objections or changes. The proposed budget was covered in depth and several items were either clarified of changed. The final budget will be presented in November and voted on by the Board.
