







FOR SALE: Standing Chisel Mortising Machine

I just purchased Richard Gillingham's horizontal mortising machine, so I am now selling my Baleigh MC-1000TT 1hp floorstanding tilting table chisel mortiser. It was purchased in 2017, has been lightly used, and is in excellent shape. The table has X-Y adjustment by handwheels and tilts front-back. The drill head tilts L-R, so it can do compound angle mortises.

I'll sell for \$850 (current list \$1451). Includes mortising chisels, plus an after-market mobile base and a set of diamond sharpening cones for the chisels.
