#### **Lutherie, an Unexpected Occupation:**

Brian Griffin retired as an insurance broker 32 years ago and soon found himself in another business selling and writing about Orchard Mason Bees. After a dozen years in the bee business he retired again to relax and play his homemade ukulele. His retirement did not last. For the last dozen years he has found himself in another business, Lutherie, the making of stringed instruments, namely the ukulele.

Griffin will tell of the unexpected growth of his new business, show us some of his instruments and discuss the methods and materials used in building a ukulele. He might even play us a tune.





#### Raffle Prize at the March 7th Meeting!

This month's raffle prize is a 9" x 12" granite surface plate. Normally seen in machine shops, this twenty pound piece of stone has ultra flat surfaces, (flat to .00005"). Ideal for checking flatness of items, it also allows for very accurate vertical measurements from its surface. In addition, it can be used for many general-purpose sharpening tasks. Simply wet the surface and lay a piece of wet/dry sandpaper (grit of your choice) and the capillary action of the wet stone will keep the sandpaper secure.



Call to order: 7:02 by John Ellis

#### **Treasurer's Report - Al Ashley**

- Cash balance approximately \$2,500 more than last year at this time see Al's report
- 28 non-renewals, but still membership is 10 more than a year ago.
  - o 9 folks told him they would not be renewing membership
  - o 19 did not communicate so may still choose to renew. Al has asked Membership Committee to reach out to these members to see if they want to rejoin, if they're comfortable doing so.
- So far, 8 new members since January (some may have joined in late December but didn't pay till January, so different than what Jerry reports in email)

#### **Committee Reports**

#### **Membership Committee - Jerry Couchman**

• Email: 6 new members this year plus 1 previous member rejoined.

#### **Programs Committee - Chuck Barnett - help from Craig Edwards and Peter Gantt**

- Presenters confirmed through June
  - o March Ukulele Craftsmanship, Brian Griffin (in person)
  - o April wood (to be more focused), Russ Yeager from Edensaw (Zoom or hybrid)
  - May project design, Jim Tolpin from Port Townsend School of Woodworking (in person)
  - June Lumi Nation Totem woodcarver Jewell James (in person)

- Suggestions from members: utilizing vacuums in woodworking, boat night, wood finishing, wood bending, hand tools (Japanese vs American), furniture styles; speaker: Steve Dando from Pratt Fine Arts Center
- Speakers fees?
  - Budgeted \$3,000 for the year (10 speakers at \$300)
  - Previously ranged from \$200-\$350 for some of the bigger named speakers, most of whom were on Zoom
    - Club members aren't compensated
    - Non-club members within driving distance perhaps \$250 for inflation
    - Out of towners \$300-350
  - o In the past: Program Chair would take speaker out to dinner and club would reimburse for speaker's meal. Club has paid for hotel room in some cases.
  - o Chuck, Peter, and Craig will reach out to their presenters and discuss fees

#### **Library Committee - Bill Pierce/Richard Gillingham**

No update

#### **Education Committee - Andrew Pellar**

- A few classes for March but dates not confirmed; working out April and May
- Trying to get larger shops even if those folks aren't teaching
- Trying to reestablish intro to using power tools for newer woodworkers
- Requested waiver from Greg for students to sign to increase the comfort level for teachers/ shop owners
- Andrew will review old newsletters to see who was teaching pre-pandemic; John has a list of all programs/field trips/classes from 2010-2017 and will send it to Andrew
- Andrew is going to reach out to folks who took the classes in the past and see if they'd be available for questions, like an informal mentorship.
- Consider: How should we allocate the class spots considering in-person, Zoom, hybrid meeting model?

#### **Toys For Tots Committee - John Braun**

- Val won't be able to host toy build sessions for a while
- John B and John E went to Barry Tomkins shop in Bellingham expressed interest in hosting. Barry would be happy to do evening or weekend sessions till 9pm.
- Another member in the south has a shop and would like to get involved

#### **Shows Committee - King Dahl**

 Reached out to Woodfest and Anacortes Arts Festival. Both will get back to him with paperwork/contracts

#### **Old Business**

#### **Program Committee**

- Members at large right now but it's not a permanent solution
- John will talk to members who have been in the club a long time for suggestions on who
  to directly ask about joining the committee
  - Other committee chairs are encouraged to do the same for their own committees

#### **MV Library**

• Little Free Library doors will be ready once hinges come in

#### **New Business**

#### **Committee Tasks/Responsibilities**

- Currently 7 standing committees (including inactive Shop Tours Committee)
- Bylaws allow for establishment of temporary committee as needed (no vote on board)
- Could establish Service Groups instead (no vote on the board)
  - Photography could just be a volunteer; new member Travis Bartholomew expressed interest; Charlie Drake has a compact backdrop
  - o Picnic Every other year. This year is the woodturners' year
  - o Refreshments Coffee Club, currently in action and rocking it
  - Preferred vendors (re-start) discussion of previous liaisons; has historically been part of the membership committee tasks
- Job Descriptions: written during strategic plan process approx 5-10 years ago (Library has copies of final Strategic Plan). John condensed and standardized them.
  - o Review the job descriptions pertinent to your committee; send John comments

#### **Production of Badges (and fasteners)**

- Greg has made badges using the new logo
- Alder, cherry, and birch work well; elm doesn't look as nice
- Fastener ideas:
  - Pins didn't work well, magnets weren't strong enough. Greg, Al, and King had different methods of using cord that work well

#### **Future Meetings**

• Confirmed with Christian School for the rest of the year but something could come up last minute, or we could decide to have a field trip one month instead of a meeting.

- Hybrid meetings March will be a hybrid meeting if we can figure out technology.
- How many club members want the Zoom option? It's a lot of hassle for just a few people. Perhaps we do a poll?
  - Pre-covid, 80-90 people on average attended. We had 45 at the library last time (but different location and no presenter). Zoom meetings started out a little higher and tapered off.
  - o If we're going to continue doing this, Greg recommends buying a club computer so we're not relying on someone's personal computer. If Greg or King can't make it, then we don't have the Zoom option.
  - o Christina or Christi can also be a backup.
- King won't be available in March would like info for newsletter ASAP



# **NCWA** Resources

Click this link – <u>NCWA Resources</u> – for our user-friendly database serving the purpose of storing information about recommendations from NCWA members.

There are 5 tables (1 tab for each) across the top, you can click each one to see its contents. This page is evolving and being updated in real time, so there will be new additions frequently.



- **Commercial Resources:** list of companies (incl website and phone #) and what people recommend them for
- **Educational Resources:** online resources for different topics, grouped by topic (this doesn't have to be limited to videos, we can have books and other stuff too)
- **Members Recommend:** This table is automatically generated by the first two, and keeps track of who's recommending what
- **Recommendation Topics:** This is another automatic table, and lists commercial resources (the first table) grouped by topic
- **Locations:** a final automatic table that lists which commercial resources (again, the first table) are located in which cities, so that it's easier to see what's near you

Let Tony know, or post on NCWA-Chat, what you think. This has the potential of being a super convenient, user-friendly database for all members.
