Robert "Bob" Doop 1937-2023

He was a "presence" wherever he went.....a big man with a big voice....and often a mischievous twinkle in his eye! Most of all he was mentor and friend to anyone who wanted to learn.

<u>Technology</u>

- Greg and George went to the school and were able to broadcast via Zoom, but sound and video synchronization was off a little bit
 - Could a presentation be recorded and sent later rather than cast over Zoom?
 - Yes, but would not allow for audience participation
 - Sending out later would encourage people to attend in person
 - Putting videos up on YouTube may draw in new members
 - Not confident that a true hybrid meeting will work yet. Would be nice to do a test to see if real-time cast will work during an upcoming in-person meeting, though not sure if this is something we will want to do; we just want to have the option.
- Will we be able to show Zoom presentation of an East Coast presenter at an in-person meeting? Do we want to be able to do that or would we prefer to keep Zoom meetings over Zoom only? More discussion to come.
